Do you know you have a choice? At least that is what God tells us in His Word the Bible. In this booklet, you will find out more about the choice that faces every human being on the planet: the most important choice you and I will ever make.

Why Do We Need to Choose?

God who created us for a loving relationship with Him and who also created the world as a perfect environment for us to exist in, has given us a choice. The options God gives are life with Him, here, now, and forever (life and blessings), or a life without Him now and eternally (death and curses). The choice we make now will determine our eternal destiny.

The reason for the choice is explained in the Bible. Genesis, the first book of the Bible, describes that God made this world perfect. God made Adam and Eve the first humans in His image and likeness (perfect and without evil) to rule over the earth in the perfect environment of the Garden of Eden, in the way He rules heaven.

“Then God said, “Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth”. (Genesis 1:26).

God gave them instructions not to eat the fruit of the “Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil” in the Garden of Eden, warning that if they did, they would surely die. This “death” would occur because of the entrance of evil called sin. Sin separates people from God and destroys their relationship with Him because He is perfect, holy (without sin) and eternal.

Satan communicating supernaturally in the form of a serpent, caused Eve to question God's instruction (that they would die). She was led to eat the fruit and give some to her husband Adam. Adam and Eve failed their first test when they listened to Satan and disbelieved God, this led to what is known as "The Fall".

In disobeying God, Adam and Eve were exposed to the consequences of evil known as "curses" which he never intended for them. He also cursed the serpent.

**"And I will put enmity
Between you and the woman,
And between your seed and her Seed;
He shall bruise your head,
And you shall bruise His heel". (Genesis 3:15).**

Many do not understand why God would treat human beings in this way and say He is unfair. Remember God created human beings out of love and for a loving relationship with Him. This is the principle that directs everything He does, sin damages this relationship.

In the Bible God makes clear that without a relationship with their Creator this world cannot survive in the long term. Separation from God can be compared to our lungs being starved of oxygen or our heart being deprived of blood – death will quickly follow. Life without God who created us cannot last. He is our source of life physically. Life without God's love leads to spiritual death and that is no life at all.

“He who does not love does not know God, for God is love”. (1John 4:8).

What Happens If I Don't?

A wise father once said to his son who sought advice whether to choose between a career as a singer or as a teacher: "If you try to sit on two chairs, you will fall between them. For life, you must choose one chair".

There is no such thing as sitting on the fence when it comes to living in this world. There are 2 powers that govern this planet and everything existing within it: God who is good personified and Satan, a fallen angel who is evil personified. Many people do not believe this, and it impacts both their worldview and the choices they make as a result.

We can all see the evidence of the influence of good and evil affecting the world. All around us we can experience the beauty of creation, loving relationships, the birth of children for example. Natural disasters, wars, and famine provide evidence of death and destruction. In other words, no choice is automatically choosing death over life.

There is a battle between the forces of good and evil involving every human being on earth, described by one author as the "great controversy". This global phenomenon concerns every aspect of human existence. It has a bearing upon us as individuals, our families, and every form of social grouping. It influences our lifestyles as well as our physical, emotional, and spiritual wellbeing.

This controversy also impacts every stratum of society, irrespective of age, gender, class, nationality, ethnicity, education, religion, economic status, or political affiliation. There is no escape from the battle, all are required to engage in it whether they want to or not.

The Good News

“For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life”. (John 3:16).

At the same time Adam and Eve experienced the consequences of disobeying God, He set in motion “the plan of salvation” to save humans from the curse of death and restore the perfect relationship that He had with them before their fall.

God’s plan to save humans from the consequences of evil took the form of sending His Son Jesus Christ (second person of the Godhead) as our substitute. It is no accident that John 3:16, the scripture referred to above is the most popular Bible verse in the whole world. It describes “agape” which is the highest form of love, originating from God and lavished upon undeserving humanity. It is unconditional, unselfish, and unending. Once it is accepted in the human heart, the natural response is to reciprocate it in a loving relationship with God that is shared with others.

“Who can measure the love Christ felt for a lost world, as He hung upon the cross, suffering for the sins of guilty men? This love was immeasurable. It was infinite”. Ellen White.

Jesus was sent into the world to do 2 things: 1) to live as a perfect human being to cancel out the effects of the

evil committed by Adam and Eve and, 2) to die on the cross and become the very curse that they experienced because of their disobedience to God.

The Hebrew name for Jesus is Yeshua which means “God is Salvation”.

“He came to pay a debt He didn't owe because we owed a debt we couldn't pay”.

Pause for Reflection

Consider what agape is and how precious you are to God; how does it make you feel?

Yes, you heard it right, Adam and Eve brought evil into the world which resulted in the curse of death upon humanity. Jesus Christ the Son of God paid the price in full by living a perfect life, then dying on the cross to become the very curse pronounced upon the people of this world.

God accepted Jesus' sacrifice in place of fallen human beings, known as "the atonement". He cancelled the debt caused by sin and restored our relationship with Him once and for all. The benefits of the atonement are available for those who believe God's Word in the Bible, seek His forgiveness, and accept Jesus Christ as their Lord and Saviour.

"The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Jesus Christ our Lord". (Romans 6:23).

The Bible communicates the “Good News” or Gospel of Jesus’ sacrifice for humanity, from its beginning to its end. It is divided into two parts: the Old and the New Testament.

The Old Testament describes life before Jesus Christ and contains many prophetic writings which foretell His appearance on earth as the promised Saviour of the world. The New Testament describes His life, death, and resurrection. It also refers to His Second Coming when He will take to heaven those who believe in Him and His sacrifice on the cross, to live with Him forever.

Jesus is described by the Apostle Paul in the New Testament as the “Second Adam”. His sacrifice not only saved lost humanity from eternal separation from God, but it will also restore the perfect life that was first experienced by Adam and Eve in Eden.

Jesus Died So We Could Have A Choice

How Do I Make a Choice?

“Even if you take a thousand steps from God, you only have to turn around and take one step back towards Him, because He has followed you all the way”. David Marshall

In Revelation the last book of the Bible, God describes how life will be before the world ends. The choice every human, consciously able to make is between being “sealed” by God (receiving life and blessings) or being “marked” by Satan (receiving death and curses).

“Then I saw another angel ascending from the east, having the seal of the living God. And he cried with a loud voice to the four angels to whom it was granted to harm the earth and the sea, saying, “Do not harm the earth, the sea, or the trees till we have sealed the servants of our God on their foreheads”. (Revelation 7:2-3).

Can you imagine it, God puts the destruction of the world on hold just to ensure that the full number of Christians described as “servants of our God” are sealed? Sealing is the essential qualification for salvation and preparation for the Second Coming of Jesus Christ.

“Then a third angel followed them, saying with a loud voice, “If anyone worships the beast and his image, and receives his mark on his forehead or on

his hand, he himself shall also drink of the wine of the wrath of God, which is poured out full strength into the cup of His indignation. He shall be tormented with fire and brimstone in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence of the Lamb". (Revelation 14:9-10).

There is a stark contrast between being sealed and being marked. When people choose God's way of life and blessings, He pulls out the stops to ensure that they are saved. When people reject His way, He has no option but to leave them to the consequences resulting from separation from Him who is the source of life. The scripture above reveals the judgment of God visited upon those who reject His offer of salvation through Jesus. This is a tragic end for those who rebel against God – they are destroyed.

Many people have heard about the "Mark of the Beast" that will be used to categorise people living at the end of time. According to the Bible without the mark, no one can buy, sell or be active participants in society. This places pressure on people (including Christians), to comply with authorities and world rulers who are against God, to survive.

Some commentators describe the mark as a microchip or a tangible sign on the body. Very few make mention of the sign that will distinguish people who have chosen to follow God which is called "The Seal of God".

Whilst it is true that the “seal” and the “mark” will identify people who have either chosen God’s offer of life and blessings or Satan’s offer of death and curses, they more importantly signify who they have chosen to worship and show their allegiance to.

Just think - a seal is usually applied to something that is “valuable” such as a legal document, whereas a mark is placed upon something that is “owned”, such as an animal. According to the Bible the seal provides freedom in Christ, and the mark enslaves to Satan’s rule!

Pause for Reflection

How does understanding that you have a choice between either having the seal of God or the mark of the Beast help you to decide?

What Is Worship and Why Does It Matter?

“Worship is giving God the best that He has given you. Be careful what you do with the best you have. Whenever you get a blessing from God, give it back to Him as a love gift. Take time to meditate before God and offer the blessing back to Him in a deliberate act of worship”. Oswald Chambers.

The word worship is derived from an Old English word “weorpscipe” which means to show honour, respect, worthiness or value to something or someone. It is demonstrated by the time we spend, our attitude towards and the attention we give to the source of our worship.

The Bible stresses the importance of worshipping God because He is our Creator and as mentioned previously, He lovingly made human beings for an intimate relationship with Him.

Satan is a fallen angel who once held the highest position among angels in heaven and was closest to God. Because he wanted to be worshipped himself, he rebelled against God and became His enemy. This resulted in Satan’s expulsion from heaven to the earth along with a third of the angels where he continues his mission to pursue worship from those who are estranged from God.

“And war broke out in heaven: Michael and his angels fought with the dragon; and the dragon and his angels fought, but they did not prevail, nor was a place found for them in heaven any longer. So the great dragon was cast out, that serpent of old, called the Devil and Satan, who deceives the whole world; he was cast to the earth, and his angels were cast out with him”. (Revelation 12:7-9).

Not only does God encourage us to prioritise what is best for our eternal future, He too is seeking out those who are passionately and genuinely interested in forming a loving relationship with Him.

Worship of God is an all-encompassing activity and lifestyle. It involves communicating with Him through prayer, Bible study, singing songs and expressions of praise and thanksgiving alone, with others in small groups, or in church. It is an instinctive response towards God by people who are determined to get to know and love Him. When we reject God, we are unwittingly worshipping Satan.

“But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshippers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him”. (John 4:23).

Satan’s mission is to turn as many people as possible against God to join him in rebellion. As referred to previously, this earth is the battleground for the conflict

between those who worship God and those who worship Satan.

“We all worship. And, ultimately, we all worship one of two things: the creation or the Creator. One the creation, this fallen creation is what we need to be saved from; the other, the Creator, is the only one who can save us from it. Creation or Creator? Whom do we worship?”

God Is Inviting You to Be 'Sealed': What is That All About?

*"Commit your past to the Forgiveness of God,
Commit your present to the Love of God,
Commit your future to the Providence of God".
David Marshall*

By now you will have realised that God is inviting you to choose life and blessings and to be sealed. What does this entail? God's loving nature means that He will never compel anyone to choose Him otherwise it would be force rather than love. God invites us all to enter a love relationship with Him.

Those who remain faithful to God will receive His seal. The prophetic books of Daniel and Revelation make clear that loyalty to God will attract opposition. In the battle between the forces of good and evil Satan uses every method at his disposal to turn people away from God. This includes force, punishment, and persecution. God has promised throughout the Bible that He is with His people and will never forsake them. The reward for all who are committed to God is unsurpassable- it is eternal life.

The process of sealing takes place as people follow God's commandments or laws summarised below:

"Jesus said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with

all your mind.’ This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets”. (Matthew 22:37-40).

God also recognises that it is not possible for us to keep His commandments without His help. Through the help of the Holy Spirit (third person of the Godhead) God gives us the ability and willingness to both love Him and follow His commandments.

Satan, on the other hand, as the enemy of God, aims to do the opposite to Him. He has no law or commandments. He leads people to engage in “lawlessness” to keep them away from God’s love, blessings, and the promise of eternal life.

“Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God”. Corrie Ten Boom.

How does it make you feel to know that God’s commandments reflect His love for you, and He has sent His Holy Spirit to help you to keep them?

Law Or Lawlessness and Consequences

“The law is like a flashlight. If suddenly at night the lights go out, you use it to guide you down the darkened basement stairs to the electrical box. When you point it toward the fuses, it helps you see the one that is burned out. But after you’ve removed the bad fuse, you don’t try to insert the flashlight in its place. You put in a new fuse to restore the electricity”. Fred Brown.

In choosing between life and blessings or, death and curses, God is appealing to individuals to decide between following or rejecting His law. When Satan was banished from heaven, he established his own kingdom upon earth symbolically known as Babylon, which in Hebrew, means “confusion”.

Satan governs his kingdom through lawlessness. By rejecting God’s law, individuals devoid of its moral compass, are led to do what they think, or feel is right. Lawlessness creates chaos and confusion within people’s lives and within the world.

“Whoever commits sin also commits lawlessness, and sin is lawlessness”. (1 John 3:4).

Throughout the Bible there are many examples of people who practiced lawlessness and the consequences that resulted. Without the protection and safety that God’s law provides, humanity spirals out of control:

**“There is no truth or mercy
Or knowledge of God in the land.
By swearing and lying,
Killing and stealing and committing adultery,
They break all restraint,
With bloodshed upon bloodshed.
My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge.
Because you have rejected knowledge,
I also will reject you from being priest for Me;
Because you have forgotten the law of your God,
I also will forget your children”. (Hosea 4:1-2,6).**

For example, God caused a worldwide flood saving only Noah, his wife, three sons and their wives along with selected animals in the ark. This was due to the “great wickedness” of humanity (see Genesis 6:5-7). In chapters 18 and 19 of Genesis, God destroyed the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah because of “very grievous sin”. Following centuries of rebellious practices of idolatry (false worship) and disobedience, God allowed the Jewish nation to be taken captive by Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon, where they remained for 70 years (Jeremiah 39-42).

Not only does the Bible provide an account of the plan of salvation, it also reveals why it is necessary. Jesus’ sinless life and perfect obedience to God’s law was the only way to counteract the universally destructive nature of sin and its detrimental effect upon the human race.

How Can I Choose Life and Blessings?

“It is not earthly rank, nor birth, nor nationality, nor religious privilege, which proves that we are members of the family of God; it is love, a love that embraces all humanity”. Ellen White

The ten commandments first given by God to the children of Israel, reveals His nature and He wants it to be ours. By keeping them, we are learning how to worship God in a way that pleases Him. This is how people receive the seal of God. Keeping the commandments also benefits our relationship with others.

The first four commandments focus upon our relationship with God.

- The first commandment stresses the importance of putting God first in our lives as our Creator.
- The second commandment tells us to worship only God and not idols (carvings or statues that represent God, other gods or anything in heaven or earth such as the sun, moon or stars, nature, or animals).
- The third commandment refers to how we show respect to God by not misrepresenting His name or character.
- The fourth commandment serves as a reminder that God Created the heavens and the earth in six literal days. He rested on the seventh day and named it “Sabbath” which He blessed and made

holy for a special time to worship Him. The Sabbath will be discussed in more detail in the next section.

- The remaining six commandments focus upon our relationship with each other and forbids sins against the person. It begins with children respecting their parents, then commands us to not kill, steal, commit adultery (sexual sins), lie or covet.

God desires us to first have a loving relationship with Him and through His influence for good in our lives, we can also have loving relationships with others.

1st “You shall have no other gods before Me.

2nd “You shall not make for yourself a carved image—any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth; you shall not bow down to them nor serve them. For I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me, but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments.

3rd “You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain, for the Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain.

4th “Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord your God. In

it you shall do no work: you, nor your son, nor your daughter, nor your male servant, nor your female servant, nor your cattle, nor your stranger who is within your gates. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day. Therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and hallowed it.

5th “Honour your father and your mother, that your days may be long upon the land which the Lord your God is giving you.

6th “You shall not murder.

7th “You shall not commit adultery.

8th “You shall not steal.

9th “You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

10th “You shall not covet your neighbor’s house; you shall not covet your neighbor’s wife, nor his male servant, nor his female servant, nor his ox, nor his donkey, nor anything that is your neighbor’s”.

(Exodus 20:3-17).

Pause for Reflection

Review the first four commandments. How do you think keeping them (with God’s help) will show your love for God? How will keeping the remaining six commandments enable you to love others?

Sabbath - The Forgotten Commandment

“Those who are acquainted with the Sabbath which God has blessed, share in a blessing because God made it a blessing by putting His blessing upon it”. Ellen White.

To worship God in a manner that pleases Him means to keep all His commandments. Observing the Sabbath commandment has caused much confusion. In His foreknowledge, God introduced this commandment with the word “remember”.

Most of the Christian world observe Sunday the first day of the week as a day of worship rather than Saturday which is the seventh day. The Sabbath day was established at Creation to serve as a reminder that God finished His work and rested on this day- celebrating it with Adam and Eve.

Sunday worship was endorsed in the early part of the 4th century by the Roman Emperor Constantine who converted to Christianity and wanted to unite Christians and Jews who worshipped on Sabbath, with his pagan subjects who worshipped on Sunday (the day of the sun), under his rule.

The Sabbath is the first covenant in the Bible (a formal agreement or promise between 2 or more parties) and is at the heart of the commandments. Sabbath as a covenant within a covenant, acts as a bridge between God and humanity. It is a weekly memorial of God’s

work of Creation and restoration in which He invites people to worship.

Sabbath is the only day that God sanctified (made holy) and placed a special blessing upon and is an opportunity to restore the relationship between God and humanity that was broken because of the fall. These God-given gifts of blessing and sanctification are available to all who choose to worship God in the way He has outlined in His commandments and by keeping the Sabbath holy.

“And on the seventh day God ended His work which He had done, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done. Then God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it, because in it He rested from all His work which God had created and made”. (Genesis 2:2-3).

The commandment to keep the Sabbath not only leads to us to worship God on the day that He established, it also like an ancient seal, defines who has ownership and provides evidence of this.

“Speak also to the children of Israel, saying: ‘Surely My Sabbaths you shall keep, for it is a sign between Me and you throughout your generations, that you may know that I am the Lord who sanctifies you’.
“It is a sign between Me and the children of Israel forever; for in six days the Lord made the heavens

and the earth, and on the seventh day He rested and was refreshed". (Exodus 31:13,17).

The Sabbath commandment tells us who God is – Creator; what His territory is – heaven, earth, and sea as well as His character- holy and the only one who can make others holy, in effect “seal” them for eternal life.

“The Sabbath is a place of refuge in a weary world. Each week we leave the cares of this world and enter God’s retreat center –The Sabbath”. Mark Finley.

Pause for Reflection

Think about a special date that you commemorate such as a birthday or wedding anniversary; how would you feel if it was forgotten by others?

To Choose, or Not to Choose, that is the Question

Charles Spurgeon, a renowned minister in the 1800s, was called to the home of an elderly woman dying of malnutrition.

- *He saw a framed document on the wall and asked her about it.*
- *It was given to her at the death of an English nobleman, whom she had served for 50 years.*
- *She couldn't read or write – the document had hung there for 10 years unexamined.*
- *She reluctantly let him take it and get it examined.*
- *It was a notification of her inclusion in the will of the nobleman. He had left her a home, money, and servants, yet she died in poverty and of malnutrition. An inheritance unclaimed is the same as not having one at all!*

The Choice is summarised in Revelation 14:6-12 in The Message of Three Angels

"If you lose Heaven, you lose everything; if you gain Heaven, you gain everything". Ellen White.

"Then I saw another angel flying in the midst of heaven, having the everlasting gospel to preach to those who dwell on the earth—to every nation, tribe, tongue, and people— saying with a loud voice,

“Fear God and give glory to Him, for the hour of His judgment has come; and worship Him who made heaven and earth, the sea and springs of water”. And another angel followed, saying, “Babylon is fallen, is fallen, that great city, because she has made all nations drink of the wine of the wrath of her fornication”.

“Then a third angel followed them, saying with a loud voice, “If anyone worships the beast and his image, and receives his mark on his forehead or on his hand, he himself shall also drink of the wine of the wrath of God, which is poured out full strength into the cup of His indignation. He shall be tormented with fire and brimstone in the presence of the holy angels and in the presence of the Lamb. And the smoke of their torment ascends forever and ever; and they have no rest day or night, who worship the beast and his image, and whoever receives the mark of his name”.

“Here is the patience of the saints; here are those who keep the commandments of God and the faith of Jesus”.

The Three Angels Messages recorded in Chapter 14 of the book of Revelation highlight the significance of the choice that every individual must make to determine their eternal destiny.

Another word for angel in the Bible is “messenger”. The messages given by these angels are communicated by

Christians who keep God's commandments and as a result play their part in sharing the Gospel.

The first angel's message reminds the whole world of the Good News: God sent Jesus Christ to the earth to be a substitute for humanity's sins. It is both an everlasting and a global message which calls everyone to show respect to God by honouring and worshipping Him as Creator.

God wants the whole world to know about His love through the Gospel. This message also informs people of the consequences (or judgements) resulting from obedience to or rejection of His law and offer of salvation through His Son Jesus Christ.

The second angel warns of the "fallen" condition of those who having rejected the Gospel, are following Satan, and living in a state of lawlessness, which is symbolised by Babylon.

The third angel describes the eternal consequences of following Satan. These people give their allegiance to the beast (world religious and political systems aligned with satanic principles) by worshipping him and receiving his mark on their forehead or hand. The forehead represents the mind in that they have chosen to follow Satan. The hand signifies actions that follow making this decision.

"The Three Angels' Messages are the final messages of warning to the world. These messages ensure that
